Andrew McKernan an arborist and Director of Garden Glow Tree Care, an office bearer of the Victorian Tree Industry Organisation, and a volunteer at the Knox Environmental Society, presented a most interesting and informative presentation on "*Creating Habitat for birds and animals in dead trees*". Andrew brought along some tree samples and demonstrated how habitats designed for specific species are carved into dead trees.

Andrew also spoke about a "Gardens for Wildlife" program now most successfully established through the Knox City Council. The concept created keen interest from those present at the meeting. It was suggested that FoDC could perhaps encourage residents who live around Damper Creek Reserve to plant out their gardens similarly to create a wider corridor to attract native birds and wildlife. Monash City Council is organising a community event as part of Seniors' Month to again showcase Mt Waverley's bushland reserves and to encourage residents & visitors to walk through and explore these unique and peaceful locations.

This year both the Friends of Damper Creek Reserve & the Friends of Scotchmans Creek and Valley Reserve will be combining to showcase Damper Creek Reserve's bushland. In previous years bushwalks have been held in in Scotchman's Creek and Valley Reserve. A rolling powerpoint presentation for both groups will be held in Alvie Hall throughout the morning.
