A mid winter's day dawned showery and cold but fortunately the rain eased so that 1,000 of 1,500 understorey tube stock, funded by Yarra Valley Water, could be planted south of Bengal Crescent in Damper Creek Conservation Reserve under the trees in the established garden beds. This mid storey planting to restore habitat for small birds is supported by Yarra Valley Water's commitment to the community and the environment.

It is anticipated that the remaining 500 tube stock will be planted during the 25 August working bee. Location TBA.

Diary date reminder – all welcome

<u>Guest speaker - Dr Gary Presland</u> <u>Title: "A brief history of Kooyong Koot".</u>

Wednesday 28 August 2024, at Alvie Hall, commencing at 7.30pm followed by supper.

Gardners Creek, aka Kooyong Koot, represents the prime example in Melbourne of all the various ways in which an urban stream can be treated.

Dr Presland will contrast the uses to which the stream has been put to by Europeans since 1935, with the ways it was considered and used in the Indigenous world of the Kulin.

Dr Gary Presland is an archaeologist, historian and writer, with particular interests in both pre-contact Aboriginal history and natural history in the Melbourne area.

He is the author of several published books on Aboriginal history, including First people: the Eastern Kulin of Melbourne, Port Philip and central Victoria (2010). His study of the natural landscapes of Melbourne won the Publication category in the 2009 Victorian Community History Award.

Gary is a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society of Victoria and an Honorary Associate of Museums Victoria.
