Restoring the Waterways and Floodplains of the Murray.

Our guest speaker at our meeting on May 24th was Gillis Horner. His presentation covered the floodplain ecosystems (we now know about Lignum scrub), regrowth of River Redgums (keep the animals out) and the methods of maintaining swampy ecosystems in the face of recurring droughts (engineering reverse flow of the Murray). Gillis's presentation prompted vigorous questioning and was most entertaining. We thank Gillis for coming to our group and wish him well with his future career.
