

Future programmes for Damper Creek

The committee had an onsite meeting and walk through the reserve with the Monash Heritage & Conservation team (Bushcrew) to discuss the management priorities and opportunities for the next few years.

While maintenance of previously planted areas will continue to be an important activity for the Council and the Friends, the focus for the Melbourne Water grant in the coming years will be in the "Fern Gully" area. The objective for this area is to improve habitat for small birds between Swayfield Road and Tarella Drive and to address erosion problems in the vicinity of the "Fern Gully".

The Friends will develop a 5 year framework to guide our activities and to identify further projects to both influence and support the Bushcrew management objectives.

The Friends look forward to working in a new section of the reserve and hope to promote our work to new residents. We will continue to support citizen science by promoting the National Bird Count and use of the INaturalist App.

November meeting Guest Speaker: Maxwell Campbell Subject:

Biodiversity, Holobionts and Symbiosis – Understanding or Misunderstanding Our Natural World. Current President (8+ years) of the Field Naturalists Club of Victoria. Maxwell is an experienced naturalist, macro photographer and microscopist with a special interest in video microscopy and is heavily committed to the conservation of biodiversity and ecosystems. His major interest is invertebrates and their symbiotic relationships. He has been a biologist, educator and active naturalist for nearly 60 years.

Maxwell will discuss aspects of biodiversity, holobionts and symbiosis and its importance to conservation and regeneration. The critical importance of invertebrates has been grossly under estimated as there is an over-emphasis on vertebrates. He will illustrate his presentation with micro videos and photographs of lesser-known organisms.

Nature Strip Gardening

The City of Monash has expanded its nature strip planting programme to include the toughest part of the job, removing the original grass. The Council will pay a contractor to remove the existing grass provided there is a total of 100m to be removed in the street. Each householder will get a voucher for 50 indigenous plants and \$50 towards mulch. Get your neighbours on board and apply for permits from
