



From the President's Desk

Spring in Damper Creek: The Aussie bush unfolds its glories over a long period, beginning in mid winter with wattles and progressing till mid summer. Sometimes it takes a little patience and observation skills to realise how marvellous the process of spring flowering is. In the wild, little things can be hidden in the undergrowth, sometimes waiting for a bushfire or for a tree to fall to open the canopy and allow the smaller plants to be revealed. As a "Conservation Reserve", the management of Damper creek tries to allow natural processes to determine what survives and what flourishes. This results in the unkempt appearance which is typical of the Australian bush. One exception to this is the newly planted area we call the "Wildflower Meadow". The area was mulched in March 2022 and planted out in June/July the same year. Many of the plants which are scarcely a year old are now flowering, an indication of what is to come! The next page shows a few of the plants that are flowering now. In the next few weeks keep an eye out for:

Chocolate lilies, Arthropodium strictum

Bluebells, Wahlenbergia sp

Clustered Everlasting, Chrysocephalum semipapposum

Running Postman Kennedia Prostrata

Billy Buttons Craspedia sp
Golden Bush-pea Pultenaea gunnii

There are others, see if you can add to the list.
